

Anti-Slavery & Human Trafficking Policy

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Our Commitment

It is important to us that we employ ethical business practices that are aligned with our Company Values to deliver our vision. As such Klozers recognises that it has a responsibility to ensure there is no Slavery or Human Trafficking both in our supply chain or any other part of our business. Our commitment to this policy also extends to our clients, and as such our company will never knowingly work with any client that does not share our values and commitment to the eradication of Slavery & Human Trafficking.

Our Antislavery Policy:

We have therefore started to take appropriate steps to ensure that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in, or connected to our organisation by:

- Requiring new suppliers to declare that they are not involved in modern slavery or human trafficking and have not been subject to any investigation in connection with any offence involving slavery or human trafficking.
- Making provisions in our template contract documentation requiring our suppliers to take appropriate steps to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in their supply chains.

This policy builds upon Klozers' existing policies which can be found on our website www.klozers.com but is specifically aligned with our commitment to pay as a minimum, the Living Wage to all employees.

Responsibility
